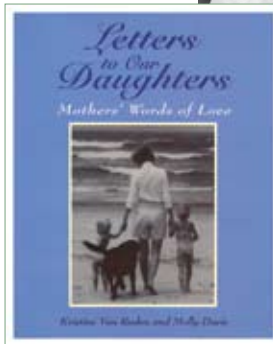
Kristine and Molly have been best friends for over 30 years, and have been inspiring audiences across the country to discover what truly matters.
